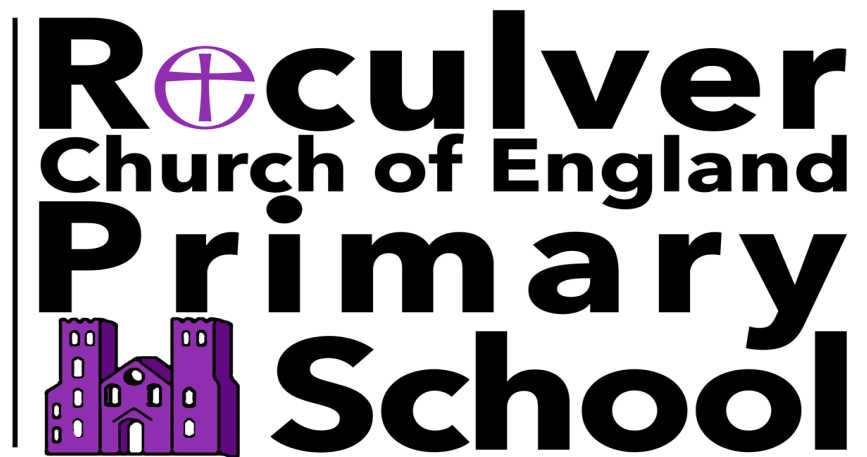


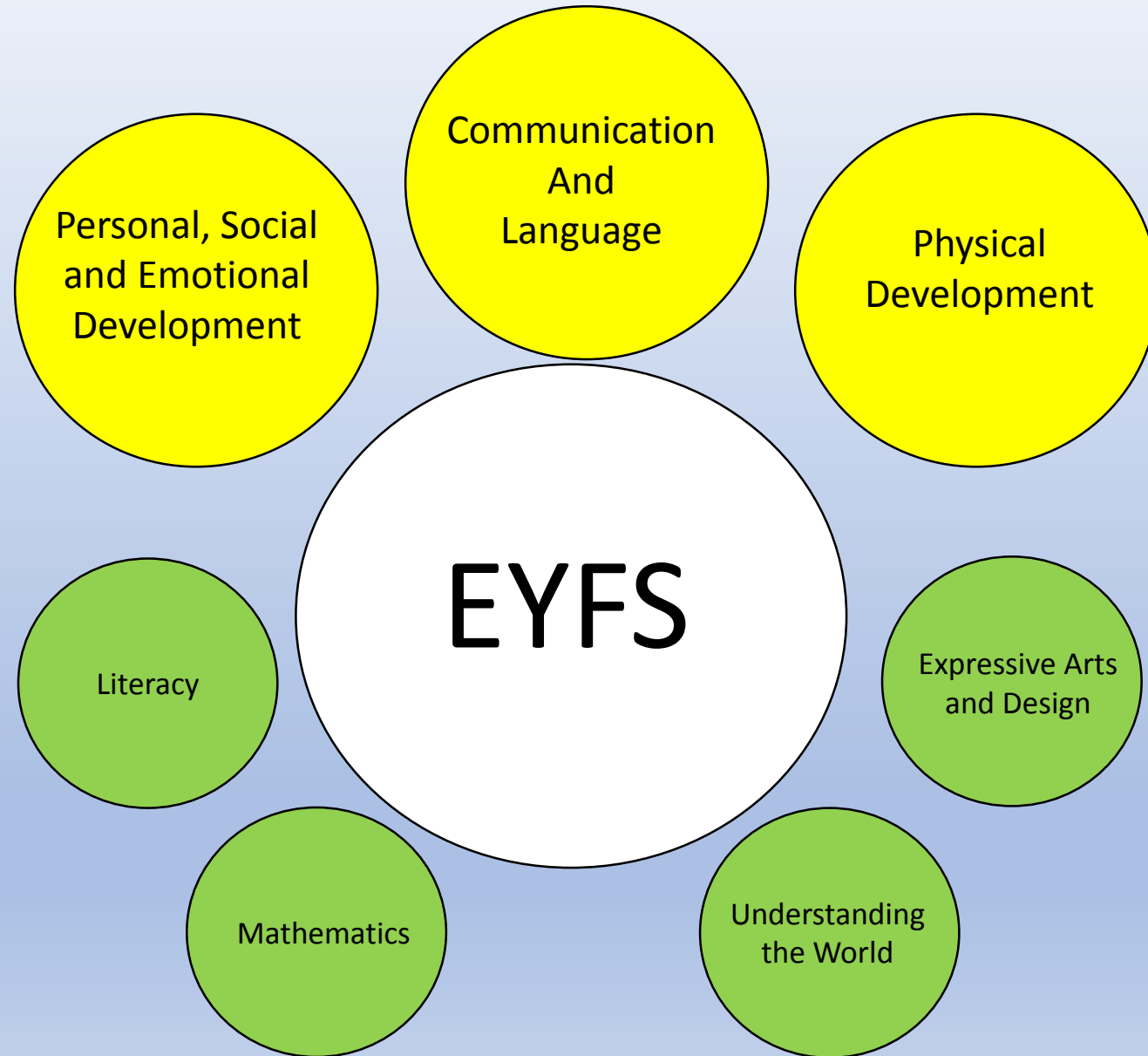

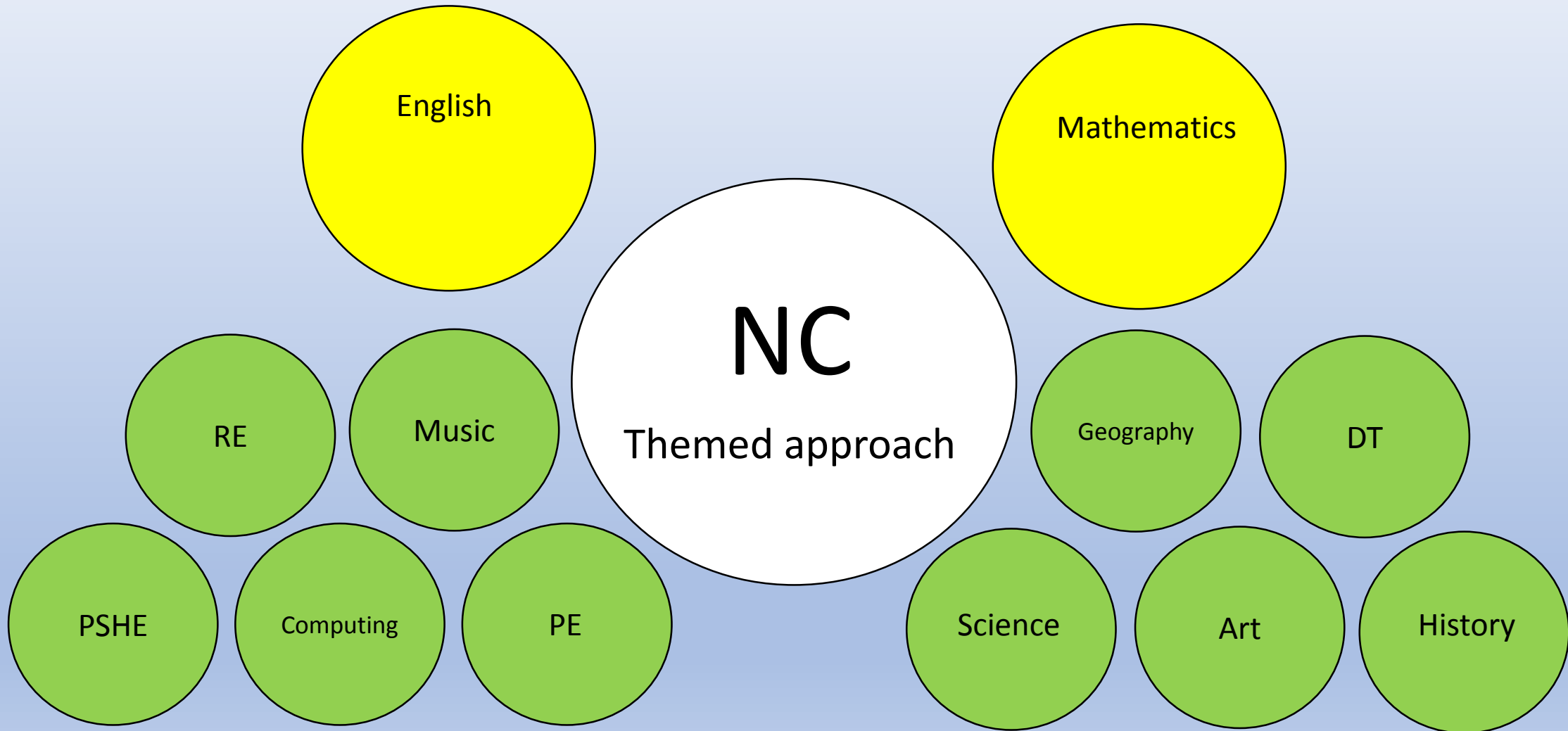

Class Organisation for the Year 1/2 Class

- The year 2 topic themes will be followed
- The English will be taught through the year 2 topic themes but there will be Year 2 objectives/success criteria and Year 1 objectives/success criteria
- In Maths the children will work in learning groups with the adults linked to their class.
- We will be using different areas in the school, similar to RWInc.

How we prepare the children

- The children now know their class teachers.
- Visits to Year 1 Classroom.
- Visits from Year 1 teacher.
- Circle time discussion – ‘Moving On.’
- Each child has made a card for their new teacher to share happy thoughts and worries.
- This is then followed up to overcome worries/concerns with the children.
- Designing coat peg labels.
- Producing artwork for new classroom display.



How we prepare you

- Coffee morning
- Share expectations and show you what learning will look like in Year 1.
- Home Learning for the Summer Break
- Open afternoon, come and meet the teacher
- KS1 meeting in September.



How you can prepare your child

- Practise phonics, writing and maths at home.
- Maintain their independence with; getting dressed/undressed, toileting, washing hands, communicating their needs.
- Talking about and sharing experiences together. E.g. days out, trips to the beach, holidays.



Home Learning



- Writing
- Keep a diary of the summer break ready to share with your new class teacher.
- Send a postcard to a friend or a relative.
- Write a list of all the things you need to take out for a trip to the beach/park
- Write a shopping list of items for a picnic or a summer party.
- Write a list of all the different animals that you have seen at the zoo/on a walk in the woods.
- Letter pattern practise. Children often enjoy colouring but why not get them to practise letter patterns and individual letters instead of colouring in.

Home Learning



- Reading
- Practise reading when you are out and about, e.g. signs, leaflets that you collect from days out and attractions that you visit.
- Visit the local library
- Make a den in the garden and add some teddies and your child's favourite books.
- Bedtime stories are great where ever you are. How many tricky red and green words can you find?
- Take a bag of books for a long journey in a car, train, boat or an aeroplane.

Home Learning



- Maths
- Practise counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.
- Play estimating games and then count the objects to check how many there actually are.
- Share items equally. This can be done very simply with snacks, fruit, sweets.
- Talk to children about the different times of day and the days of the week.
- Use terms like yesterday, tomorrow, last week, next week.
- Talk about 3D shapes in the environment.

Parental involvement in Year 1

- Curriculum workshops will be organised during the Autumn Term.

- Sports Day
- Whole School Celebration Worship
